You will recruit, develop, and mentor a 9 to 12-person team of school-based counsellors to work with Immigrant and Refugee students in grades 7 through 12.

You will champion this new program and deploy both single session and longer-term counselling while also building capacity to support the mental health needs of the entire student population.

You will monitor systems, processes, and protocols that support best practices, measure outcomes, and continuously evaluate and refine the program. You will also initiate and cultivate collaborative stakeholder partnerships.

WHAT YOU WILL DO

Clinical: Lead a team of graduate level counsellors providing trauma-informed, barrier free, systemically oriented clinical services to a specialized population of Immigrant and Refugee students and their families.

Program: Assist with program outcome measurement and evaluation and ensure adherence to ethical and best practice standards.

People: Work closely with Manager, People & Culture to recruit top performers, develop engagement strategies, and implement performance development practices.
